#### Cornell Plantations Internship Program

Our summer internship program, exclusively for Cornell University students, aims to provide an educational and work experience involving hands-on training that builds on classroom learning and represents the full spectrum of work throughout our organization. Interested in a summer internship with the Cornell Plantations? If the answer is yes, submit your resume via the Cornell Plantations [website](#). This internship program is open to freshmen through seniors.

#### Rutgers Research Experience for Undergraduates

The program will give ten undergraduate students the opportunity to work over the summer with faculty mentors on independent research projects with relevance for the New Jersey Pinelands and beyond. In the first week of the program the students will do field work and reside in the Rutgers University Pinelands Field Station that offers an easy access to a wide range of characteristic pineland ecosystems, including pygmy pine forests, upland and lowland pine/oak communities, cedar swamps and aquatic and semi-aquatic habitats. After that the students will move to the main campus to perform their laboratory experiments and learn cutting-edge experimental techniques. #### Forestry Technician

The work involves responsibility for performing a variety of technical and administrative urban forestry tasks to support management and field operations activities in the Parks and Forestry Section of the Department of Public Works. The work is performed under the general supervision of the City Forester with latitude given for the exercise of independent judgment in the performance of the work. While some work is performed in an office environment, most is performed outdoors, in all weather conditions. Forestry Technicians may be required to respond to emergencies at night and on weekends.
