Writing sample (five page maximum)

Three letters of recommendation (one letter must be from a professor/university faculty)

The Environmental Defense Fund will review the applications and set up interviews with the top candidates in early May. Fellowship applicants will be notified of decisions by the end of June. Fellowships must start by September 1, 2009. Fellows will be responsible for their own travel and relocation expenses to Fellowship sites.
